What an amazingly busy year we have had. As always, our volunteers have been working hard to pack up holiday bags, which were distributed via local schools.

With the cost of living crisis, we have provided more food parcels than ever. We have had such wonderful support from our local community this year, which enabled us to provide over 860 families with a holiday food parcel, via local schools, for each school holiday. This is in addition to our regular agency referral requests.

We are so grateful to the incredible local community who are always so generous in donating food items via our local supermarkets or directly to the Hub. Many supporters donate regularly either directly by bank transfer or via our card reader and gift aid their donations which helps us enormously. Gift Aid makes a huge difference, it boosts donations by 25%.

Thank you to everyone who supports us, we simply couldn't do what we do without you!

Rethink visit regularly and are holding a drop in coffee morning at the Hub on 1st February.




Representatives from Selwood Housing regularly visit, as do our local social prescribers and our local community police officers.
